Tasks of the NPB

The primary task of the NPB is to monitor, analyze and evaluate the productivity and competitiveness of the Slovak Republic


More specifically, the NPB's duty will be to analyze any developments that may have had an impact on productivity and competitiveness, conduct independent analyses and strengthen intra-national political dialogue

The NPB will publish an Annual report on the development of national productivity and competitiveness

Becoming more productive is key to boosting competitiveness, jobs and growth. In response to the Commission's proposals to implement the **Five President's Report** on completing Europe's **Economic and Monetary Union**, the Council has recommended to euro area Member States to establish or identify independent

NATIONAL PRODUCTIVITY BOARDS.

Tasks of the ISA

The secretariat of the NPB is the Institute for Strategy and Analysis (ISA)

The ISA drafts the Annual Report in consultation with the Members of the NPB, including soliciting the Members' cooperation when collecting the required data

It prepares analyses in the area of competitiveness and innovation, possibly in cooperation with external actors within the public sector and the academia

It participates in the European network of NPBs

It facilitates organizational preparations associated with the assembly of the NPB





IMD economic performance index




